Human Papilloma Virus (HPV)

We don't have a vaccine for colon cancer.

We don't have a vaccine for breast
cancer. But there is a vaccine for
cervical, mouth and throat cancers.

We encourage all children to be
vaccinated against HPV regardless of sex.



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Dear Parent or Guardian:

The HPV vaccine is the only vaccine that prevents cancer. It is important for all children, both male and female, between the ages of 9-12 years old to receive the two shot vaccine series before their 13th birthday.
